- Wood is very versatile in its character and can be used in architectural detailing and interior design detailing in the outdoor spaces as well as the indoors. There is something magical about the warmth that wood adds to a space. Using it in larger proportions seldom looks overpowering, because of its subtlety and capacity to adapt to any design style.
- Besides being versatile, wood is a very durable material. If seasoned and appropriately treated, wood can last for several years. Today, the market is full of high-end finishes and treatments that make it easier to maintain.
- The natural texture of timber has beautiful organic grains, which are unique. The material provides the possibilities of varied tones, all of which add a distinct language and character to the space.

- 6) The material has natural acoustic properties that absorb sound and vibrations. This characteristic makes it an ideal choice for larger rooms and spaces, where one needs to minimise sounds and cut echo.
- 7) Wood is an energy-efficient material as it holds heat and regulates humidity. This is one of the reasons why most vernacular mountain homes are made up of wood.
- 8) Most importantly, it is a renewable material that can be regrown naturally through replanting. The processing of wood has fewer environmental implications as compared to trending materials in the market today.
